TYPICAL PROFILE

Bright and complex, with floral aromatics, berry and citrus fruit, and wine-like acidity.

Vietnam, Indonesia, India, Papua New Guinea

TYPICAL PROFILE

Full-bodied and earthy, with low acidity, deep spice, cedar, dark chocolate and herbal notes.
